Deferred until 2005 Legislative Session

The Legislature in 2003, due to a \$10 billion shortfall, deferred materials from the 2004-05 biennium into the 2006-07 biennium. The deferred materials did not go into classrooms in August 2004 and are sitting in warehouses awaiting purchase and delivery to classrooms in August 2005.

Schools will order materials in Spring 2005 for delivery in Summer 2005, to be used in the 2005-06 school year and beyond. These materials were adopted by the State Board of Education in November 2003 (deferred materials) and November 2004 (new materials).

New Materials

New materials were adopted by the State Board of Education at their November 2004 meeting after a rigorous review process that ensures materials meet the state's curriculum (the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills) and are free of factual errors. Schools will select the books in Spring 2005 for delivery in Summer 2005.
